

Rain Closes Show, Washes Out Bridge

They may be the gods of grunge rock 'n' roll, but Pearl Jam was not powerful enough to stop the rain on Wolf Mountain Saturday night.

Torrential rain soaked 12,000 fans in the outdoor Wolf Mountain theater at Park City before the concert was canceled. Band leader Eddie Vedder shouted through a bullhorn, "Thanks for coming out here. Please don't get sick. We're going to come and play twice as long."

A spokesman for the promoter told fans to hold their tickets because the band would reschedule.

Sanpete County officials said residents reported a bridge washed out in Fairview, and Yuba Lake was spilling over.

In Garfield County, a car with unknown number of occupants hydroplaned off a bridge on eastbound Interstate 70. The car flipped as it hit the Colorado River and floated downstream before sinking.

Rain in the southeast part of Utah pushed the Green River and two of its tributaries over their banks and onto roads. Dry Fork and Ashley Creek flooded.
